World Day of Prayer for Vocations

Next Sunday, May 3rd, is a special Easter celebration of Good Shepherd Sunday. In 1963, Pope Paul VI designated this day as *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. Our parish will join with the universal church to ask for God's blessings that we may be strengthened in our Christian vocation.

YEAR OF ST. PAUL

What does Paul mean by the expression "in Christ"?

This is one of Paul's simplest yet most profound expressions. Baptism incorporates one "into Christ" in a totally new fashion. Paul believed that faith dramatically changed an individual. For a person of faith, reality itself is changed. "Thus if one is in Christ, one is a new creation." (2 Cor 5:17).

Being incorporated into Christ means becoming totally reborn. By virtue of baptism this action involves dying with Christ, becoming dead to the power of sin, and living an entirely new life "in Christ" (Rom 6:11). Those who live "in Christ" participate in his death and resurrection (Rom 6:8-11). It means surrendering to the power of Christ in such a way that one allows a risen Christ to direct completely his or her life. So dramatically changed is a person that Paul goes so far as to say, "... it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me" (Gal 2:20). In essence it is a mutual indwelling of Christ in the believer and the believer in Christ. "Taken from Ronald D. 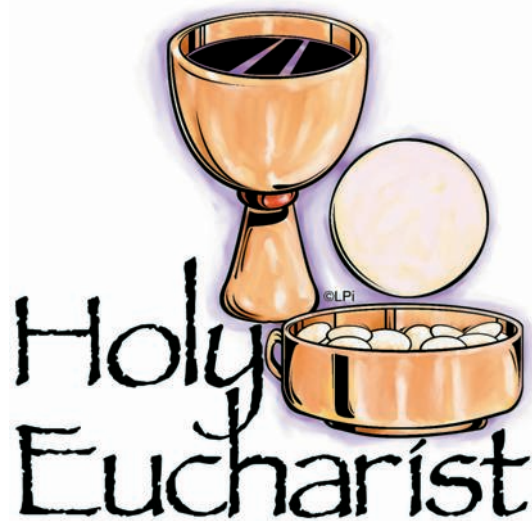

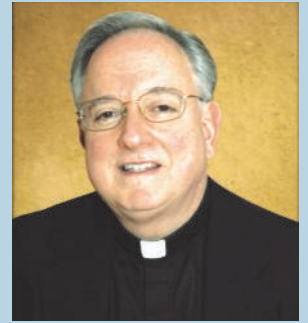
Hopes Center ~ Fair Trade Sale

In October of 2008, the Dominican Sisters opened the doors to the HOPES CENTER of Racine in downtown. This center of hope offers a variety of programs, which focus on the five areas represented in its name – H (healing), O (opportunity), P (peace and justice), E (ecology) and S (spirituality). The downtown location was chosen to make its services accessible to people in our community who struggle to obtain counseling and healing.

Inside the HOPES CENTER is a "Cup of Hope" Coffee Shop and "Just Trade" Store. This spring and summer, Sixth Street is undergoing major construction, which could have an adverse affect on the businesses and organizations that call Sixth Street home. In an effort to support this community project, and in lieu of having Blest Art here this year, we have invited the Racine Dominicans to bring their fair trade items from around the world to our parish. Items will be displayed and ready for purchase next weekend, May 2nd & 3rd, in the gathering area after all Masses. Please support this collaborative, community social justice project.

Bishop William Patrick Callahan Named Diocesan Administrator

On April 20, 2009, Milwaukee Auxiliary Bishop William Patrick Callahan was elected by the Archdiocesan College of Consultors to serve as diocesan administrator of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. In that role, Callahan will oversee the day-to-day activities of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee until Pope Benedict XVI appoints a successor to Archbishop Timothy M. Dolan. According to the Code of Canon Law (law of the Catholic Church), when a bishop vacates a diocese, an administrator is either named by the Holy Father or elected by the diocesan College of Consultors, a group of priests who advise the local bishop on diocesan matters.

Child Abuse Prevention Month

Ensuring Your Child's School is Safe

Every teacher, coach, and volunteer who works with children in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's parishes and schools must have a background check before he or she is permitted to work in any school or parish related job or activity that involves contact with children. But what about the children who attend non-Catholic private or public schools? Talk with school administrators and find out what steps they take to protect children from harm. Suggest that they review other abuse prevention programs to ensure that their policies and practices are up to date. And demand that all employees and volunteers who work in the school be properly screened, including background checks, before they are allowed to be near your children.
