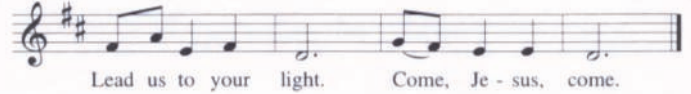

Year End Contributions

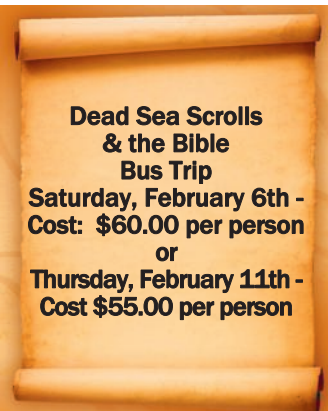
