Weekly Scripture Synopsis

February 1st ~Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Deuteronomy 18:15-20; 1 Corinthians 7:32-35; Mark 1:21-28

What do we expect when we are in the "presence of God"? In Deuteronomy the presence inspires terror; in Mark astonishment. Why the difference? A real growth occurred between the early days of Israel and the coming of Jesus. God was no longer seen as a terror to be appeased, but a presence to be worshipped.

In a sense Paul also addresses the same issue in his strange command to not marry. Why? The Lord was coming back in Paul's lifetime and there was no time to waste on anything other than preparation for the full coming of the Lord.

YEAR OF ST. PAUL

Why does Paul use the idea of becoming "slave of Christ"? Doesn't that infringe on our personal freedom?

Not in Paul's thought. The Greek word Paul uses for slave (doulos) also means servant. Paul proudly calls himself a "slave of Jesus Christ" (Rom 1:1). The term applies to his colleagues as well. (Col 1:2) Paul considers slavery to Christ to be a most freeing experience because one does not need to worry about fulfilling prescriptions of the law. Slavery to Christ means single-minded devotion in the will of God revealed in Jesus. This devotion also entails servitude to old ways or a new and freeing "servitude" to the new ways revealed in Jesus. Slavery is not a restriction of personal freedom for free-choice commitment to Jesus Christ and all that he demands. Attaching ourselves to Jesus Christ as his slaves or servants paradoxically frees us to be of broader service to those around us. "Taken from Ronald D. How will parish goals be determined?

The expectation for each parish is that it should raise at least 100% of reportable annual offertory income over a three year pledge period. (Here at St. Paul that number represents our stewardship donations and offertory basket collections.) This number serves as a measurable benchmark for pledges and participation. Beyond the benchmark, a parish may set a higher goal that reflects the special vision of the parish and the local resources available to meet the parish vision. A professional campaign consultant will work with the parish leadership to set an appropriate and achievable goal. The leadership team at St. Paul has put an emphasis on participation. No donation is too small and our goal is to have everyone participate at whatever level they are able. Remember 60% of all donations come back to the parish, to be used for future programs, projects and growth.
