YEAR OF ST. PAUL

Can you explain more about the women in Paul's churches? Did they have special roles?

Yes, some of the women in Paul's churches had special roles. It is difficult to describe them precisely. Chloe was a woman in Corinth whose "people" sent word to Paul about the bickering in the Corinthian church. Acts mentions Lydia among the first Christian converts in Philippi (Acts 16:15). Lydia was a "dealer in purple cloth" who was head of her own household, a fairly wealthy business woman. Paul mentions Aquila and Prisca (Priscilla) as "my co-workers in Christ, who risked their necks for my life" (Romans 16:3-4). Paul calls Phoebe a "deacon (diakonos) of the church at Cenchreae" (Romans 16:1). Paul had female co-workers. He offers contemporary

Faith in Our Future Q & A

What is the timeline for Faith in our Future?

The *Faith in Our Future* Campaign began in the fall of 2007 and it continues through June of 2009. The pilot wave of 12 parishes began planning their campaigns in the summer of 2007. All remaining parishes chose one of three waves, with St. Paul the Apostle being part of Wave III. We are in the planning stages now and will be hosting trainings and meetings in the coming months, as our Commitment Weekend draws near. Please watch the bulletin for details about some fun fellowship activities that will be open to all parishioners. Our campaign will end in June of 2009.

Will major gifts from parishioners be credited to our parish campaign?

All major gifts from parishioners are subject to the sharing arrangement determined by the Pastors Policy Committee for parishioner gifts, except in those instances of special donor instruction or designation. The parish will receive 60% of all Faith in Our Future donations, unless a donor specifies something different on their commitment card. The financial commitment of the campaign is spread over three years, and Faith in our Future funds will be deposited into a parish account on a monthly basis during the first year.

Catholic Stewardship Appeal 2009

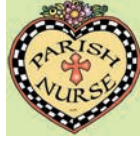


Thank You For Your Generosity
