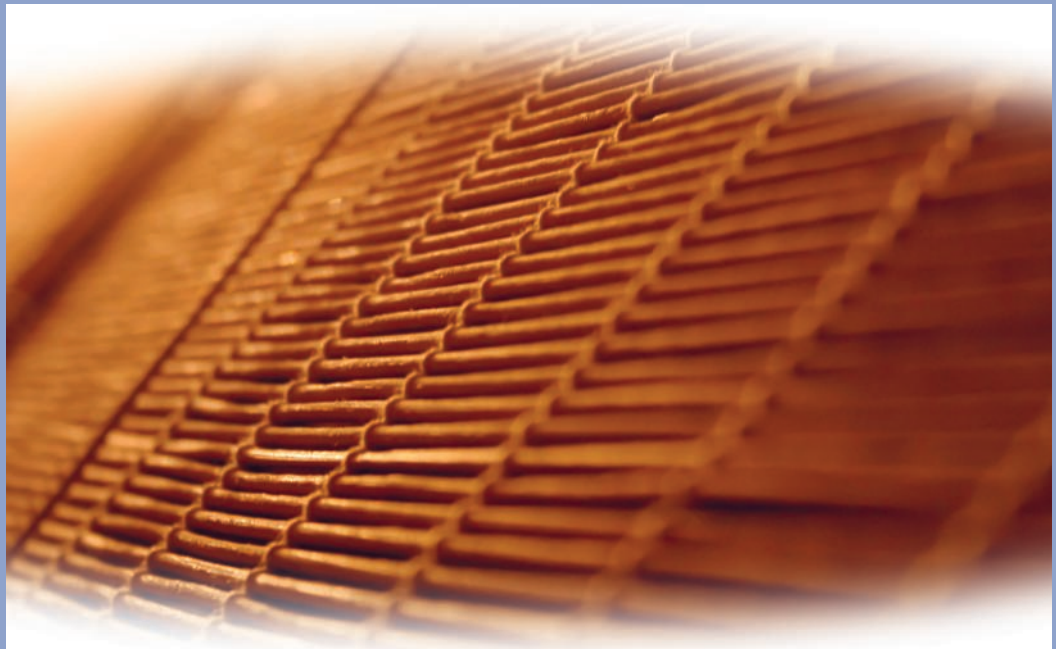

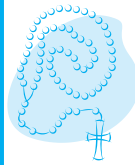
Celebrant Exchange

February 22nd ~ Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 43:18-19, 21-22, 24b-25; 2 Corinthians 1:18-22; Mark 2:1-12

The word that rises from all of today's readings is God is doing something new. The new thing – total forgiveness. Isaiah tells us that God will wipe out our offenses and not remember our sins.

February 25th ~ Ash Wednesday

Joel 2:12-18; 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:2; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18

The call of today's readings is for an internal, not an external, time of penance and conversion. Joel says it perfectly: "Rend your hearts, not your garments". "Now is the time of salvation" as Paul says. Jesus invites us to real change not just the outward change that impresses others.

Fast Before Communion

Something we are becoming increasingly aware of and that is significant, has to do with the "fast before Communion" rule. The church rule is that we are not to eat or drink (water excluded) one hour before receiving Communion. Since Communion takes place about 45 minutes after the beginning of Mass, you may eat up to 15 minutes before Mass begins. Those with health conditions such as diabetes or cancer, are exempt from this fasting rule. For these people, it is particularly important that they eat before coming to Mass.

YEAR OF ST. PAUL

Does any one letter summarize Paul's ideas?

The closest that one comes to a general summary is the Letter to the Romans. Most scholars judge Romans to be the most comprehensive and synthetic of all Paul's letters, but it does not develop every idea common to Paul's thoughts. In Romans, Paul discusses justification, faith, hope, love, sin and its consequences, grace, freedom and slavery, power, salvation, the body of Christ, the relation of the Jews and Gentiles, reconciliation, and so on. Paul did not establish the Roman community and had no substantial personal acquaintance with them. He avoids using strong familial expressions with them for the same reason. He writes to them as a fellow believer rather than as a parent to one's children. "Taken from Ronald D. Faith in Our Future Q & A

How much will the FIOF Campaign cost, and what expenses will our parish incur?

Based upon the Archdiocesan goal of \$105M, expenses will total approximately 8.5% or \$4,398,000. Campaign expenses include professionally printed and designed materials, video production, professional consulting fees, gift acknowledgements, postage for defined mailings, and all pledge fulfillment over the next five year period. Expenses are paid from the Archdiocesan share of campaign revenue. Our parish will be responsible for minimal postage expense, but will incur costs related to additional parish campaign promotion, meetings, printed material, video production and special events. With groups of committed volunteers, our parish will be able to keep expenses to a minimum. Some material will be made available for pick-up after weekend liturgies, which will save our parish money on postage. We encourage all parishioners to take an active part in the Faith in Our Future Campaign, not only by your financial commitment, but by sharing your time and talent!
