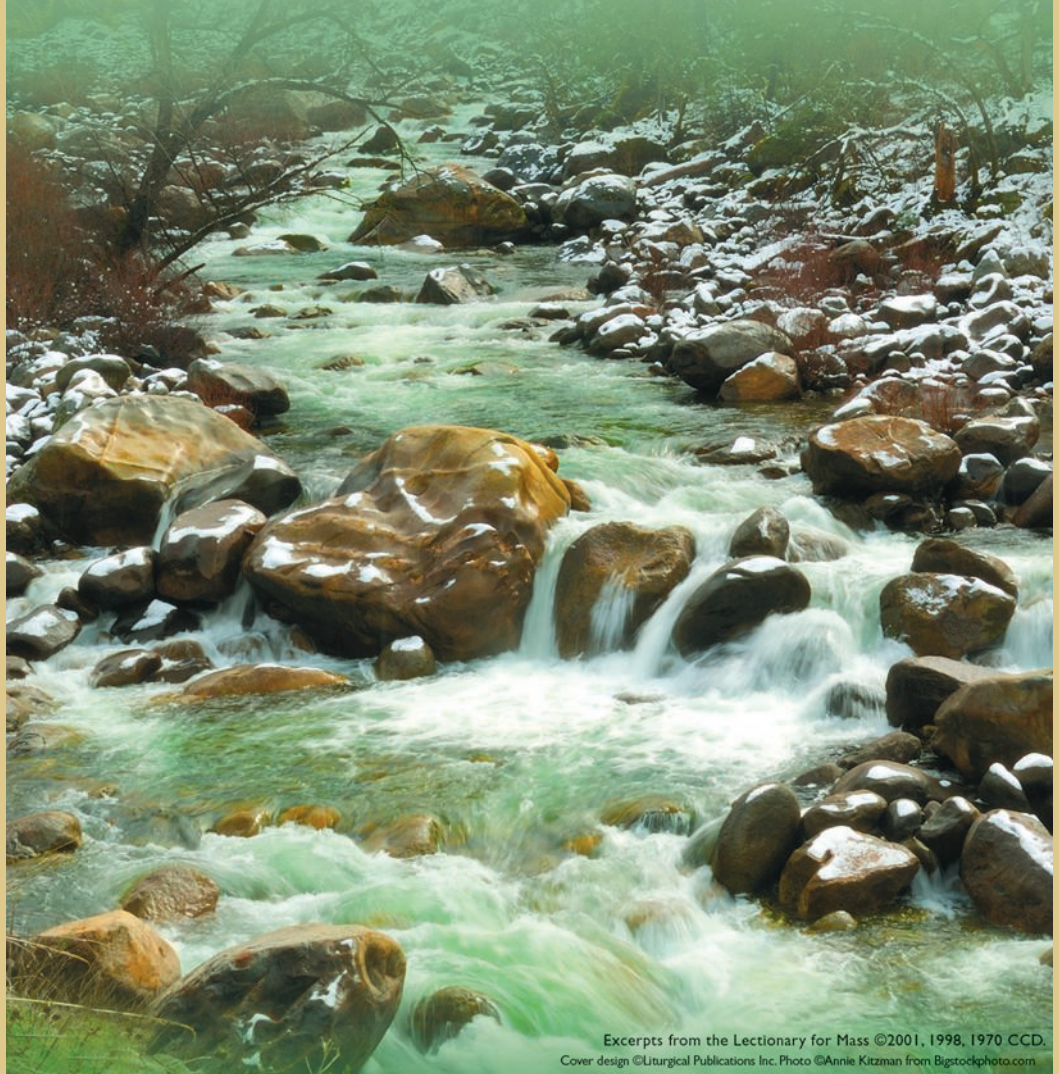

Weekly Scripture Synopsis

January 24th ~ Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nehemiah 8:2-4, 5-6, 8-10; 1 Corinthians 12:12-30; Luke 1: 1-4, 4:14-21

In our Gospel, Jesus announces that he is the one who has come to bring the Good News. If we look at our other two readings they give us some of the substance of that "Good News". Nehemiah tells the people the Law of God is to bring rejoicing, not sadness. Paul calls us the body of Christ. Each one of us is a part and together we make up the whole. We are dependent on each other completely.

Haiti Relief

In Pope Benedict XVI's first encyclical, *God is Love*, he urges us to care for others, "Love of neighbor, grounded in the love of God, is first and foremost a responsibility for each individual member of the faithful... As a community, the Church must practice love. The Church is God's family in the world. In this family no one ought to go without the necessities of life. We contribute to a better world only by personally doing good now, with full commitment and wherever we have the opportunity."

To help us fulfill this commitment, our parish is reaching out to the people of Haiti, by supporting the efforts of the Office for World Mission at the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Donations are being collected, with 100% of the funds distributed as follows: one-third to Catholic Relief Services for immediate relief, one-third to the Haitian parishes and organizations who support sister parishes in Haiti, and one-third to be held for later distribution to meet long term needs that will arise in the months to come. Last weekend at all Masses, we took up second collections for Haiti Relief and raised \$11,465.91. Thank you for your generosity and concern for our brothers and sisters in Haiti struggling with the necessities of life.

We will accept donations over the next few weeks and ask that **checks be made payable to St. Paul the Apostle Parish**. Cash will be accepted, but in order to receive a tax deductible credit, you will need to put the money in an envelope, marked clearly with your name. Credit for these donations will be shown on your stewardship letter.

With your gift we were able to supply the young parents with parenting books designed just for teen parents. We were also able to help a student who lacks family support and suffers from much emotional and physical abuse. WALK THE TALK WITH YOUR CHILDREN

There is a hint of a new theme emerging in the media these days. It is different from what we have been reading and hearing about in the recent past. It is not judgmental. It is an observation. It certainly has a lot to do with health, but from another perspective. It relates to our life at church as well as to our lives at work and at home.

The new theme is that what an individual does has an effect on other people. Up until now, it seems, we have heard and read more about the rights and importance of the individual. Now, it seems, there is a recognition that our behavior as an individual influences all the people around us whether we realize it or not...whether we intend to or not. This is not a new theme to us as Christians.

Pastors have made this statement during sermons, "Never underestimate the influence you have on the life of a child." Have you ever thought of the weekly grocery shopping list as having a profound, lifetime effect on your children? Have you ever thought of the Sunday morning conversation about going to church as having a profound, lifetime effect on your children? Or put another way, "Do you always walk the talk?"

Here are a few ways we will continue to have a positive effect on others at church. Have a tissue handy to cover your nose and mouth when you sneeze or cough. Slow down in the parking lot so you can see the children, before they emerge from the row of cars. Stop and let folks who need more time to proceed unhurried across the parking lot.

May the Lord of Life continue to bless our families with wholeness and peace.
