## YEAR OF ST. PAUL

*Why is Jesus the "new Adam"?*

As far as we know, Paul is the first Christian to have made the comparison between Adam and Christ. It serves as an excellent illustration of how Paul uses Old Testament texts in an innovative way.

A comparison can be made between Adam and Jesus Christ because, in Christ, God is virtually making a new creation. Paul's comparison looks like this:

<u>Adam</u>	<u>Christ</u>
first man and human being	last Adam
became a living being	became a life-giving spirit
natural being	spiritual being
earthly being	heavenly being
we bear his earthly image	we bear his heavenly image
brought sin into the world	brought salvation into the world by grace
was disobedient	was obedient
brought death into the world	brought resurrected life into the world
all shall die	all shall have life

We can see from this comparison that Paul has carefully thought out the theological implications of Christ's coming. Eternal life becomes a possibility for all who are modeled after Christ, whereas death is the reality for all modeled after Adam. "Taken from Ronald D. 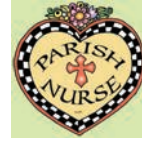

### NECESSITIES FOR A LIFESTYLE CHANGE



When was the last time you decided to change or had to change something in your life that affected your health? For most of us, my guess is that the had to change situation popped to mind first. They did for me. Seems that we are more prone to ignore our health unless there is discomfort that interferes with things we want to do. We take our health and our lean, teen, body machine for granted – long past our teen-age years.

When faced with changes, we usually focus on the things we will be 'giving up' or 'missing'. The next thought is usually, "I can't do it. I can't change." So, we do nothing. Or do we really, do nothing?

A wise woman told me recently that three things are needed for making changes related to a healthier lifestyle. They are – lots of information about the reasons to make the change (to persuade the mind to consider the change), time to pay attention to what the body is feeling now (to persuade the mind to connect with the body), and God to help the other two (mind and body) make a commitment to a plan for change based on His love and support during the change!

Consider these words of encouragement from Philippians 4 *"Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God...I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."*
