Parish Council ~ Definition of a Parishioner

As the Catholic Church moves more and more into collaborative ministries, our Parish Council felt that it is important for our Parish to recognize and define what it means to be a parishioner. The council developed and approved the following definition, that we ask you to read and consider. If you have any questions or concerns, please direct those to our Parish Council Chairperson, Randy Hughes or any council member.

PARISHIONER OF ST. PAUL THE APOSTLE PARISH:

A parish member is anyone:

- who recognizes that we are called to be in Communion with Christ and with one another through the Church and its sacraments;
- who accepts the teachings of the Catholic Church;
- who will help form a community through God's Grace;
- who is willing, with an open heart to grow as a Catholic Christian within the spiritual traditions of the Catholic Church;
- who acknowledges the legitimate authority of the Pope, Bishops, and Pastor.

Actual parish membership is based on the above and is determined by the following:

- being registered;
- regularly attending Sunday and Holy Day Eucharist;
- as able, supports the growth of St. Paul the Apostle Parish and the greater Church by sharing his/her time, talents and treasure.

YEAR OF ST. PAUL

What does Paul mean when he calls us "adopted children of God"?

The background of this term can be found in the Old Testament. When God made a covenant with David, he received him as his adopted son (2 Sam 7:14). In other words, the king entered into a relationship with God not as a natural son or legitimate heir, but as on who has been adopted into a legitimate line of heirs. Paul extends this notion to Christians who thereby become adopted children of God. He contrasts this legitimate adoption with being a slave. Christians are not called to slavery but to freedom (in the Christian life). For Paul, adoption is another aspect of God's gracious action toward humanity. It is the way by which we are given a special relationship with God that transforms our lives. The Spirit of God facilitates this adoption process so that we can inherit the promises God made to Abraham, which are now fulfilled in Christ. "Taken from Ronald D. Faith in Our Future Q & A

How can being a disciple of Jesus make an impact on stewardship and this capital campaign?

According to the U.S. Bishop's pastoral letter on Stewardship, *Stewardship a Disciple's Response*, living as good stewards of God's gifts flows from the fact that we are disciples of Jesus. Our Catholic Faith teaches us that we are part of something greater than ourselves. The community of faith offers us the support and nourishment of the Sacraments for our life's journey. We are aware that we are part of a great Christian family, the Communion of Saints, all the wonderful people who have gone before us in the faith, and those who will come after us.

Every age of Christian history teaches us great lessons of faith and trust and sacrifice. When God's messenger told Joseph not to be afraid to take Mary into his home as his wife, he put aside his fear of the future and made a generous commitment of his very life to Jesus and Mary – because of his faith.

Mother Theresa left a life of teaching in a private academy to care for the poorest of the poor as they lay dying. She sacrificed in order to witness to the love and presence of Jesus.

The pioneer Catholics of our Archdiocese and St. Paul the Apostle Parish made sacrifices as they built this Church in Southeastern Wisconsin. *What are we being called upon to do in our time?*

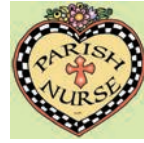
