## Weekly Scripture Synopsis

### March 28th ~ Palm Sunday

**Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Luke 22:14 - 23:56**

All of our readings lead us to enter into the triumphal procession of Jesus to the cross and resurrection. Isaiah announcing that the servant will be disgraced before men, but not before God. Paul speaks of the humbling of Jesus by becoming man yet he is triumphant and "that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, every tongue confess that Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." Two thoughts about the Passion according to Luke. First: Luke begins the Passion with the "Last Supper" a celebration of the Eucharist. He makes the full announcement of the Resurrection at the Eucharist Jesus celebrates with the travelers to Emmaus. Second: Jesus' journey in the Passion is to find who understands and believes. Look at the many opportunities he presents different people and groups. Notice who accepts the offer.
