## YEAR OF ST. PAUL

*Isn't Paul a pessimist when he describes human beings and their behavior?*

No, Paul was not a pessimist; think of him as a Christian realist. The clearest expression of what Paul has in mind is found at the beginning of the Letter to the Romans. After the customary greeting and thanksgiving, Paul explains his view that all humanity is under the power of sin. He demonstrates that Greeks are under the power of sin by listing the many symbols of idolatry and immorality in their culture (Rom 1:18-32). He draws attention to their feeble attempt to rely on human wisdom, a prominent feature in the Greco-Roman culture of his day. The result instead is folly and idolatry (Rom 1:22-23).

Elsewhere in Romans, Paul makes it clear that the human condition is one of sinfulness stemming from Adam's disobedience. This is not a pessimistic view of the world, but a theological view of what is wrong with humanity and what can cure it. Paul strongly believes that the one act of Jesus Christ - the new Adam - dying on the cross makes up for the one act of Adam, who sinned and brought all humanity with him into the tendency toward sinfulness. This position actually leads to Christian optimism. Paul continually sounds a note of "hope" that all will heed the message of the gospel, avoid sin, and attach themselves to the new life available in Jesus Christ. "Taken from Ronald D. ## Faith in Our Future

In the Faith in Our Future packet that you recently received, we provided a tan “I have a question” sheet. In this column, we will attempt to answer the questions that have been submitted. Please watch future bulletins for answers to other questions.

***Doesn't nine million dollars for Faith in Our Future expenses seem to be an excessive amount to make this campaign run?*** Many Pastors and Parish Leaders asked the same question, when the material was first presented to us. The costs involved in hiring the firm of O'Meara, Ferguson, Whelan & Conway is a cost that was incurred by the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and these expenses come out of the 40% that the Archdiocese receives. The firm that was hired has a proven, successful methodology that is based on the theology of stewardship. These expenses cover 211 parishes across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee and include all professional consulting fees, professionally printed and designed materials, video production, all gift acknowledgements, and postage and pledge fulfillment over a five year period. Our parish will incur some costs to run our portion of the campaign. These include food and refreshments, postage, printing, production of our video and miscellaneous costs. Our Faith in Our Future team are working hard to keep our costs at a minimal level.

***Where and how will my contributions be restricted to fund a specific ministry area?***

When you complete your Faith in Our Future Commitment Card on Commitment Weekend, May 16th & 17th, you will be able to specify how you wish to contribute to the campaign. You can choose monthly, quarterly, annually or one-time donations via check made payable to Faith in Our Future. Other options include EFT (Electronic Fund Transfer donations) or charge card donations. It is important to realize that regular stewardship and offertory to our parish is what sustains our parish and allows us to provide the wonderful ministries and outreach that take place here. Your regular stewardship donations are important to meeting our goals and keeping our budget balanced. Faith in Our Future donations are in addition to your regular giving, not in place of.

The donations made to Faith in Our Future are directed as follows: 60% for parish needs (per our parish case statement) and 40% for Archdiocesan initiatives and campaign expenses incurred. All funds will be held in the Faith in Our Future Trust for the use and purposes set for the Faith in Our Future campaign.

If a donor directs that his or her contribution is to be restricted to fund a specific ministry area, that intention will be honored. To do this, you will need to make a written specification on the front of your commitment card indicating your wishes.
