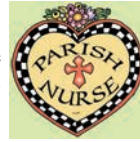
## St. Paul the Apostle Spaghetti Dinner

## What Do We Collect?

You will find a few containers on the tables in the gathering area for items that are regularly collected to support our own parish, as well as our collaborating parishes.

**Sentry Receipts Family & Friends Program:** Drop off Sentry receipts (with a Family and Friends sticker attached by the cashier.) These receipts are turned into the Sentry store and our parish receives 1% in total receipts back.

**Pick 'n Save WE CARE Program:** We receive 1% of receipt totals for anyone who is registered under our We Care parish account. This is similar to the Sentry program, but it is not necessary to save receipts. Simply stop by the service desk at any Pick 'n Save and ask that your saver card be attached to our parish WE CARE Account #800400.

**St. Sebastian School Box Tops, Soup Labels, etc:** There is a bucket on the table where you can drop box tops for education, milk caps, Campbell soup labels, etc.... You will find a list of items next to the bucket on the table.

**McDonald's Receipts:** Save any receipt from a McDonald's restaurant for St. Sebastian School. The revenues from this program are used to buy athletic and school equipment.

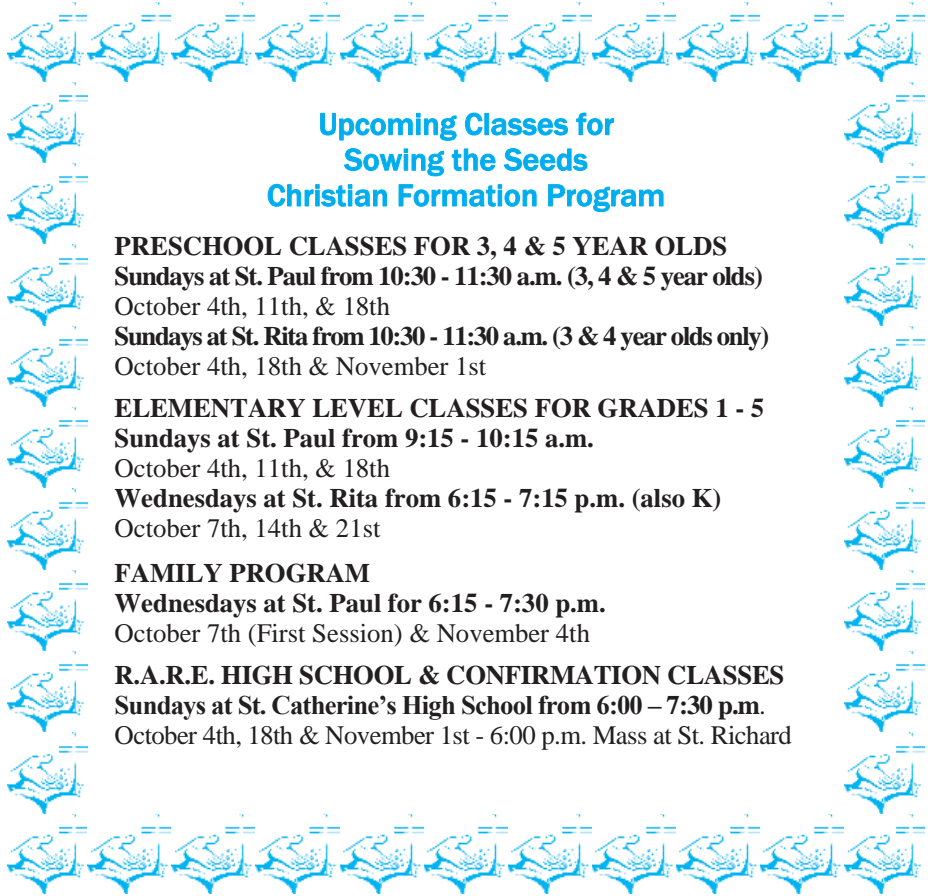
